GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE COURSE LIST

Since the 1993-94 academic year, all students in the Commerce Undergraduate Program have been expected to fulfill the Global Perspective (GP) requirement. There are three options to complete this part of the curriculum:

Student Developed Program (most common)

Students may select a series of three courses that focus on international issues. These classes are commonly Learning Domain courses *(see a guide to domain designations below) or may be used as Open Electives. The College of Commerce has prepared an approved Course List to assist students in selecting classes that will satisfy their GP requirement. Students who have transferred applicable courses and exam credit into the university will receive GP credit as is deemed appropriate by the Commerce Undergraduate Program Office advising staff.

Modern Language Sequence

Students may satisfy their Global Perspective requirement by completing a three-course sequence in a Modern Language. One course will be placed as an Open Elective with the other two Modern Language courses serving as selected Learning Domain courses. Students should contact an advisor to discuss this option and possible course placement.

Study Abroad

Students interested in participating in a Study Abroad Program or International Business Seminar are encouraged to meet with an Academic Advisor to discuss how these opportunities could satisfy part or all of their Global Perspective requirements. Please note that 300-level courses are usually more difficult than 200-level courses. Students are responsible for checking prerequisites before enrolling. It may also be helpful to consult with the instructor to determine if a class is appropriate.
